Why RSE?

‘Today’s children and young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world and living their lives seamlessly on and offline. This presents many positive and exciting opportunities, but also challenges and risks. In this environment, children and young people need to know how to be safe and healthy, and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way. ‘

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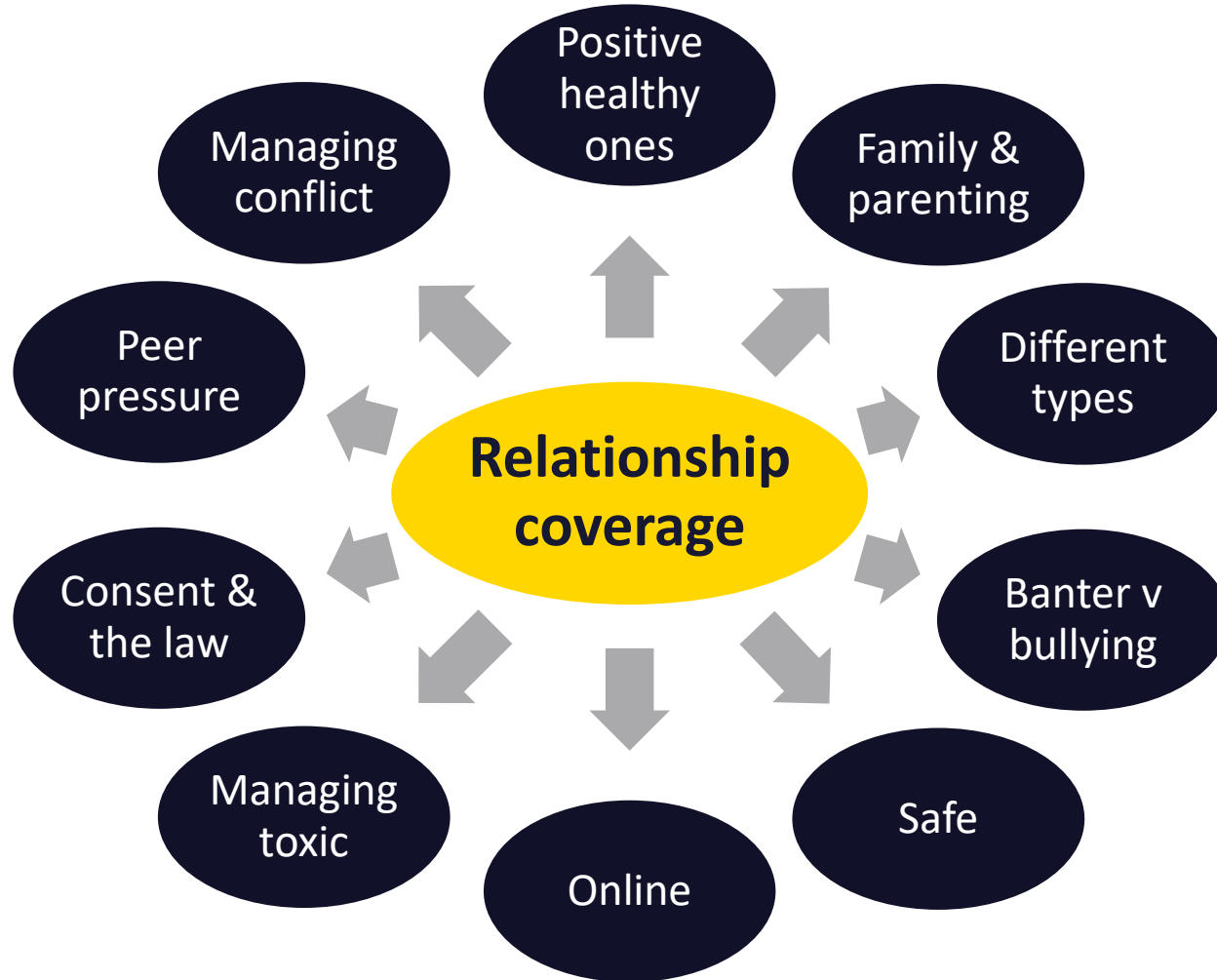
What do we teach in RSE?

We teach ...

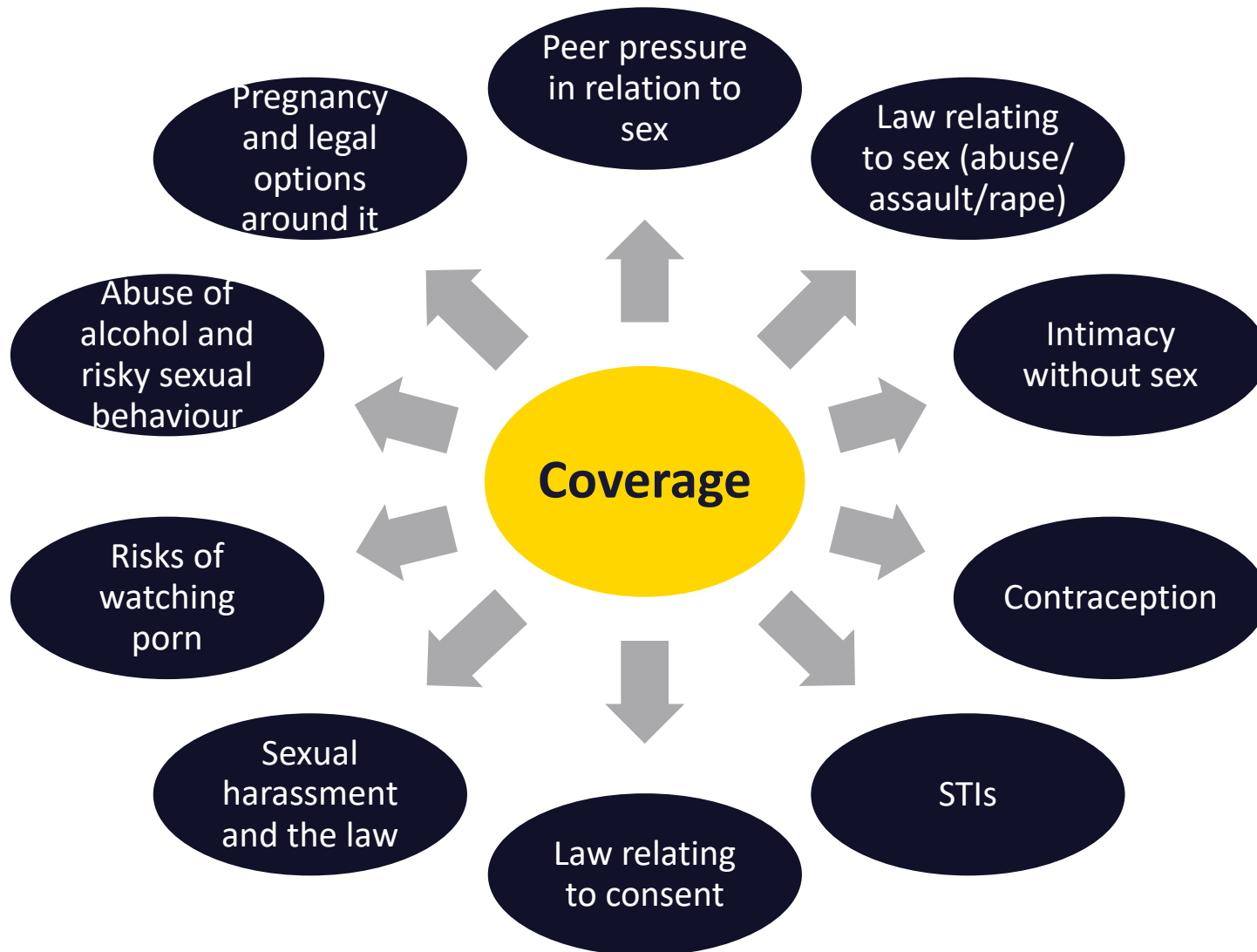
- All aspects of relationships:

My World sessions KS3

Y7

1. Know the characteristics of positive and healthy relationships.
2. Understand the difference between banter or bullying.
3. Know the role of bystanders in all types of bullying.
4. Understand there are different types of adult committed long term relationships.
5. Know the different types of relationships and their legal status.
6. Understand why marriage is an important relationship choice for many couples and how it contributes to human happiness and its importance for bringing up children.
7. Judge when a relationship is unsafe.
8. Understand online risks when using social media.
9. Know what to do and where to get support to report material or manage online issues
10. Understand how online information and data is generated, collected, shared and used

Y8

1. Know the characteristics of positive and healthy relationships.
2. How to manage toxic relationships.
3. Understand the characteristics of healthy intimate relationships.
4. Understand the law relating to consent.
5. Know how to communicate and recognise consent
6. Understand how to manage peer pressure in relation to sex

3. How can I be intimate without having sex?
4. What constitutes abuse in a home environment?
